### **Proposed Title 5 Ordinance Amendments**

# 1. New chapter for child care homes in Title 5, Business Licenses and Regulations

### Chapter 5.74 Child Care Homes

#### 5.74.010 Statement of Intent

It is the intent of the Governing Body of the City of Overland Park to regulate and set minimum standards for child care homes to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of the residents of Overland Park. Said child care homes shall be allowed in the locations for residential day care provided in Title 18 of the Code. The State of Kansas, through the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) and the Office of the Fire Marshal, has provided licensing and inspection requirements for child care homes, which the City intends to cooperate with fully and supplement with additional life-safety inspections through the fire department.

#### 5.74.020 Definitions

The following words and phrases when used in this chapter shall, for the purpose of this chapter, have the meanings respectively ascribed to them in this section unless otherwise defined in the text of the section.

- A. "Child care home" shall mean a structure designed and used as a one- or two-family dwelling where child care is provided by a child care provider.
- B. "Child care provider" shall mean the homeowner or resident licensed with KDHE to operate a child care facility from their place of residence.
- C. "Code" or "this code" shall mean the Overland Park Municipal Code.
- D. "Fire department" shall mean the Fire Department of the City of Overland Park, Kansas.
- E. "Fire inspector" shall mean a person authorized by the fire department to conduct fire safety inspections.

### 5.74.030 Inspection of Child Care Homes

Child care homes shall be subject to periodic inspections as required by the Fire Department. The fire inspector is authorized to inspect the premises for which a child care license has been issued by KDHE. Said inspections shall be conducted utilizing the applicable provisions of the Kansas State Fire Marshal Fire Safety Handbook. Reasonable prior notice of an upcoming inspection shall be provided in writing by the Fire Department. An inspection report shall be provided to the child care provider at the end of the inspection. The child care provider shall have 30 days to correct any violation(s) before a re-inspection occurs, unless such violation(s) constitutes an imminent threat to life safety, in which case immediate correction of the violation(s) shall be required. If corrections are not made in the prescribed time frame, the fire inspector may assess a failed inspection fee, and if such fee is assessed, the fire inspector shall complete a failed inspection (fee for service) report. The amount of said failed inspection fee is established by resolution of the Governing Body.

### **Proposed Title 18 Ordinance Amendments**

1. Remove Section 18.140.470, Consideration of Residential Day Care Permits, from the Applications and Procedures chapter

### 18.140.470 Consideration of Residential Day Care Permits

- A. Applications for the initial Residential Day Care Permit shall be filed with the Planning & Development Services Department and a public hearing shall be scheduled before the Planning Commission. The applicant shall be required to mail notices of the public hearing to surrounding property owners according to the procedures in Section 18.140.080, and shall be required to post a sign identifying the time and place of the hearing according to the procedures in Section 18.140.090. After the completion of the public hearing, the Planning Commission shall make a recommendation to the Governing Body. The Governing Body shall hold a public hearing and may approve the permit, approve the permit with conditions, or deny the permit. The Governing Body may refer the matter back to the Planning Commission for reconsideration or further study but shall not be required to do so under any circumstances.
- B. Applications for the renewal of a day care permit shall be filed with the Planning & Development Services Department and a public hearing shall be scheduled before the Governing Body. For the first renewal, the applicant shall be required to mail notices of the public hearing to surrounding property owners according to the procedures in Section 18.140.080 and shall post a sign identifying the time and place of the hearing according to the procedures in Section 18.140.090. For subsequent renewals, only the posting of the sign shall be required. After the conclusion of the hearing, the Governing Body may approve the permit, approve the permit with conditions, or deny the permit.
- C. The Governing Body may initiate proceedings to revoke a Residential Day Care Permit by a majority vote of those members present and voting at the meeting. The procedure and basis for revocation shall be the same as for the revocation of a Special Use Permit as set forth in Section 18.370.050.

2. Amend 18.110.155, Day care definition, to eliminate certain day care categories no longer necessary because of changes in the State legislation

"**Day care**" means the provision of supervision, training, food, lodging or medical services to persons for less than 24 hours a day.

"Child care center" means a facility which provides care and educational activities for 13 or more children two weeks to 16 years of age for more than three hours and less than 24 hours per day including day time, evening, and nighttime care; or which provides before and after school care for school-age children. A facility may have fewer than 13

children and be licensed as a center if the program and building meet child care center regulations as defined by the State of Kansas.

"Day care home" means a home in which care is provided for a maximum of ten (10) children in compliance with the definitions and regulations of the State of Kansas.

"Family day care home" means a home in which care is provided for a maximum of six (6) children in compliance with the definitions and regulations of the State of Kansas.

"Residential Group day care home" means a home in which care is provided for a maximum of twelve (12) children in compliance with the definitions and regulations of the State of Kansas.

"Mother's Day Out" means a day care program operating more than five (5) consecutive hours or more than one day per week and in which any one child is enrolled for not more than one session per week.

"**Preschool**" means a day care facility providing educational experiences and operating in compliance with the definitions and regulations of the State of Kansas.

# 3. Amend 18.390.140.B, Development and performance standards, in the Accessory Uses chapter

- B. Residential day care, Family day care homes, day care homes, group day care homes, child care centers, preschools and Mother's Day Out programs.
  - 1. Family day care homes shall be permitted provided that the day care provider shall be licensed or registered with the State of Kansas and that there are no employees other than persons residing on the premises.
  - 21. Residential Dday care homes and group day care homes shall be permitted allowed subject to the approval of a Residential Day Care Permit by the Governing Body according to the procedures in Section 18.140.470. The following standards shall apply:
    - a. The day care provider shall be licensed by the State of Kansas and shall reside on the premises.
    - b. Outside play areas shall be fenced.
    - c. Only one employee, other than persons residing on the premises, shall be permitted.
    - d. Compliance with requirements for child care homes in Title 5 of the Code.

- d. Prior to the approval of a Residential Day Care Permit or the renewal of a permit, the home shall be inspected for compliance with any applicable building or fire codes. If any deficiencies are found, they shall be corrected prior to approval of the permit by the Governing Body.
- e. The initial permit shall be valid for a maximum of one year from the date of Governing Body approval. The first renewal of a permit may be approved for up to three years, and subsequent renewals may be approved for up to five years.
- 3. Child care centers, preschools and Mother's Day Out programs may be permitted allowed as an accessory use only in religious, educational and community buildings. Such programs shall be subject to a general traffic plan being submitted to and approved by the City Traffic Engineer, or his or her designee. Such plan shall not permit parking on any adjacent public street, and shall include a drop-off and pick-up site designed to prevent traffic congestion or vehicles stacking up onto the public streets.

### Summary of Lexie's Law Senate Substitute for HB2356 June 18, 2010

Lexie's Law was signed into law by Governor Parkinson on May 27, 2010. The law becomes effective July 1, 2010.

### Key elements of the bill include:

- Revoking the statutes governing registered family day care homes and the transition of registered family day care homes to licensed day care homes.
- A requirement to establish a fee fund and increase licensing fees to fund the additional inspections required by the bill. Maximum fees that can be imposed are a \$75 base fee plus \$1 per child in the licensed capacity and for Child Placing Agencies, Maternity Centers and Child Care Resource and Referral Agencies the maximum fee is \$150. Late fees will also increase if a Licensee does not renew within 30 days of the expiration of the license.
- FY 2011 (July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011) will be a transition year and priority will be given to inspecting what are now registered family day care homes.
- All child care facilities will be inspected every 12 months in FY 2012 and that will be the year the funding to health departments will increase. In FY 2011 the bill requires inspections of what are now registered day care homes and waives annual inspections of certain types of licensed facilities that are in compliance as of July 1, 2010. The Department is establishing criteria to determine what facilities are considered "in compliance". The intent is to not burden health departments with additional inspections but to permit health departments to focus on the inspections for registered homes by waiving requirements to conduct an annual inspection for other licensed facilities.
- Child care providers serving military families will be inspected every 12 months.
- A requirement that the Department, develop through the rules and regulation process, requirements for the competent supervision of children and additional health and safety requirements necessary for the protection of children.
- A requirement that if a license is revoked under certain conditions the licensee can not reapply for a child care license nor work in a child care facility.
- A requirement to include an expiration sticker on the license stating the expiration date of the license.

- A requirement that any new applicant is a high school graduate or equivalent, such as GED. The bill provides a grandfather clause for applicants who apply before July 1, 2010 and existing registrants and licensees.
- Changes to the child care open records requirements that will go into effect in May 2011. The bill will permit the Department to release certain identifying information that is currently protected.
- A requirement to design, develop and implement an online information system so that parents and the public can access child care provider compliance history.

The bill becomes effective July 1, 2010 and will support families by increasing child safety, oversight and public health protections for children in out of home care.

I understand that I must be able to demonstrate that I can get everyone under my care, safely out of my home to a designated safe place within 4 minutes, and that I may be asked to demonstrate this ability in a fire exit drill. If children are located on the second floor, children must occasionally practice the use of the approved second floor fire escape window by going to the window and waiting for rescue.
I have working smoke detectors installed according to the manufacturer's instructions on every level of my home in the pathways leading directly to the outside and in each sleeping room used by children in my care. My smoke detectors are tested monthly and records are kept for review. My smoke detectors are powered by 10-year lithium batteries or are hardwired with battery back-up.
I have a written emergency plan for use in case of fire. All persons responsible for the care of children in my home are familiar with my emergency plan and can get the children safely outside to the designated safe place.
I understand all areas of my home may be inspected at any time by State/local officials to determine compliance with this Agreement.
I understand that an on-site inspection conducted by State/local fire officials may only occur once in the lifetime of the license. I understand that it is my responsibility to conduct an annual review of all fire and life safety code requirements.
