

ORDINANCE NO. MTI-3376

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT OF A MAIN TRAFFICWAY – COLLEGE BOULEVARD BRIDGE OVER INDIAN CREEK IN THE CITY OF OVERLAND PARK, JOHNSON COUNTY, KANSAS (PROJECT NO. BR-2020).

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 12-687 *et seq.* authorizes the Governing Body to improve or reimprove main trafficways; and

WHEREAS, on the 10th day of January, 1977, College Boulevards was designated a main trafficway by Ordinance No. MT-917; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Governing Body of Overland Park, Kansas, to reconstruct the College Boulevard Bridge over Indian Creek as hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, all legal proceedings and requirements have been complied with for the public improvement of the main trafficway;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF OVERLAND PARK, KANSAS:

Section 1. That the following main trafficway be improved or reimproved as provided by K.S.A. 12-687 *et seq.*:

The reconstruction of the College Boulevard Bridge over Indian Creek. The project also includes drainage improvements, utility relocations as necessary, restoration and other appurtenances and items incidental to the bridge reconstruction (the "Improvement").

Section 2. The estimated and probable cost of the Improvement is:

Eight Million, Five Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$8,580,000.00).

Section 3. The Improvement shall be financed from revenue sources authorized by K.S.A. 12-689, including but not limited to the issuance of general obligation bonds.

Section 4. The City expects to incur expenses in connection with the Improvement prior to the issuance of the general obligation bonds and temporary notes which will be used to finance the Improvement. The City reasonably expects to reimburse a portion of the expenditures in connection with the Improvement from the proceeds of the general obligation debt. This declaration is a declaration of official intent of the City under Treasury Regulations. The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued is Six Million Dollars (\$6,000,000.00).

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force as of the date of its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
