JOB SUMMARY STATEMENT: Assists with the Supervision of the animal care of the Farmstead operations. Performs routine animal care, including feeding, cleaning, animal waste disposal, health, and welfare. Assists with the maintenance of facilities. Provides educational materials and assistance to the public. Assits with record keeping and inventory control of animals on hand. Drives City vehicles and large machinery. Provides support to all areas of the farmstead. May be required to participate in Emergency Snow Operations.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Assists with coordination and supervision of seasonal employees. Schedules and assigns work of animal care attendants. Answers questions or assists with problems.
2. Supervises and performs animal care such as de-worming, trimming hooves, beaks and talons, and giving vaccinations and other injections as needed. Observes animals to detect illnesses and injuries. Consults with veterinarian to determine type of medication or treatment needed.
3. Maintains thorough and complete records on all animals to include identification, health, animals on hand, health testing records and disposal.
4. Assists with plans and reviews feeding schedules and amounts for all animals. Monitors animal feed supplies. Checks feed supplies; orders supplies when necessary; picks up, load and unload feed; stores feed properly to prevent spoilage and waste; prepares feed for distribution.
5. Assits with recruitment, hiring and training of Temporary/seasonal staff.
6. Acts as Supervisor in the absence of the Animal Care Supervisor.
7. Assists in planning new animal displays and procurement of new animals.
8. Assists in repair and new construction, and landscaping projects. Performs basic carpentry, plumbing, concrete and electrical work. Paints buildings and signs. Operates hand and power tools and large motorized equipment as required.
9. Performs general maintenance and repair of equipment. Checks fluid levels, repairs and replaces parts as required. Cleans and maintains equipment per equipment manual instructions.
10. Ensures a safe environment for animals, visitors, and the general public. Supervises and assists in cleaning of work areas and Farmstead facilities.

11. Assures compliance with federal, state, and local regulations relating to Farmstead operations, such as material data safety sheets, hazard communication programs, and permit acquisitions. Obtains continuing education through professional organizations by attending necessary training sessions and seminars.
12. Provides general information to public through informal and formal speaking engagements and training sessions.
13. Coordinates with other sectional and divisional personnel regarding equipment and personnel needs.
14. Performs general office duties such as answering phones, assisting general public and organizing files.
15. May be required to participate in Emergency Snow Operations.
16. The employee must work the days and hours necessary to perform all assigned responsibilities and tasks. Must be available (especially during regular business hours or shifts) to communicate with subordinates, supervisors, customers, vendors and any other persons or organization with which interaction is required to accomplish work and employer goals.
17. The employee must be punctual and timely in meeting all requirements of performance, including, but not limited to, attendance standards and work deadlines; beginning and ending assignments on time; and scheduled work breaks, where applicable.
